#### **Presidential Note:**

#### Masuo Kashiwadani, The 10th President of the ARSC

I have been appointed as the 10<sup>th</sup> president of the Applied Regional Science Conference for the two years of 2005 and 2006. The previous presidents are all outstanding and splendid scholars who played active and important roles internationally. Thus at first, I believed I did not deserve such a position and refused to take it. However, I have decided to humbly accept the position after considering that the offer of it means a mandate from the members to contribute to this academic society in my own way. I intend to tackle the management of the conference in a manner which incorporates various opinions and ideas in so far as possible. Here I would like to ask for your special cooperation to the development of this conference through your advice and guidance, and I will personally strive to contribute as much as I can.

It can be said that the 20<sup>th</sup> Century was the era of transportation. The appearance of the automobile as a machine marked the end of the 19<sup>th</sup> Century. Cars have a historical significance because their prevalence since the beginning of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century has greatly altered our way of life and the operation of industry. The airplane is another product of the 20<sup>th</sup> Century that has changed mankind's consciousness and the scheme of society. Such developments in transportation have tremendously altered the configuration of cities and regions and the relationship among regions, including that from an international standpoint. The birth and development of Regional Science is reflected in the reforms of transportation

systems which were rapidly promoted after World War II and the remarkable advancement of cities and regions along with them. In addition, computation technology, which has advanced simultaneously, has made a great contribution to the approach of spatial analysis. Looking back over the past years, study and research in this field seem to be rather simple, but actually have been strongly and steadily promoted, I believe.

Since the advent of the 21st century the circumstances of cities and regions, such as population growth stoppage or even decrease in advanced countries, and the destruction of the environment appear complicated and uncertain. Even in the field of Regional Science new objects of study and research, and methods of analysis are being seriously sought and considered. At first glance it is a seemingly difficult situation; however, this time of struggle with finding new methods for development is more important to academic study than a steady development. Fellow members of Applied Regional Science Conference gathered here today, and particularly our younger members, I certainly hope that your study and research will provide answers to these problems.

In regard to the practical management of this conference, fortunately we have reserve finances, and I would like to undertake the policy of promoting your further research and study using these funds.

In closing, it is my intention to contribute to the development of this academic field by obtaining many positive, lively opinions and ideas from all of you. Thank you very much.
