Takatoshi Tabuchi, The 12-th President of the ARSC

I have the honor of being appointed as the twelfth President of the Applied Regional Science Conference from 2009 to 2010. A number of excellent researchers have been maintained high-quality academic activities have been since the establishment of the ARSC for twenty-two years. I would like to enhance the quality of services for members by reflecting various opinions of members to the greatest possible extent. On the other hand, however, participation at the annual meeting of the ARSC seems to be dwindling in recent years. Therefore, I would like to invite you to present your papers at the annual meeting. I hope that senior members would report perspectives or reviews on specific topics in regional science in order to enlighten junior members. I also hope that junior members would present state-of-the-art research in order to ensure forward and backward linkages to diverse members. I believe that such contributions will be very fruitful for each other.

To the best of my poor ability, I would like to contribute to the development of the ARSC. Continued support by all members will be greatly appreciated.
